The University of Florida MDP program is part of the Global MDP Association, and is administered jointly by the Center for African Studies and the Center for Latin American Studies.

Each MDP student completes an interdisciplinary core curriculum spanning the social sciences, health sciences, natural sciences, and management skills; one or more specializations in the student's thematic and regional interests; and a field practicum devoted to development issues with a host organization that the student chooses.

MDP alumni are employed in organizations across the development field-NGO, government, private sector, university—around the world.

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About the MDP DEGREE

The MDP degree consists of 45 credit hours:

- ◆ Two 3-credit core courses in each of the four sustainable development pillars: Social sciences, Health sciences, Natural sciences, and Management skills.
- ◆ Two 3-credit courses to prepare for and follow up after the field practicum.
- ◆ 15 credit hours of electives focused on one or more specializations, concentrations, minors, and/or certificates.

Joint degree programs are possible: MDP/PhD, MDP/JD, or others.
